Report on Drug De-Addiction Activities by GDC Handwara

In a committed effort to combat the growing menace of drug abuse and to foster a drug-free society, Government Degree College Handwara, actively participated in a series of impactful drug deaddiction awareness and training programmes. These initiatives aimed at empowering youth as catalysts for change, spreading awareness and building community resilience against substance abuse,

As part of the college's ongoing efforts under the umbrella of *Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyaan* (NMBA), ten dedicated NSS volunteers from GDC Handwara took part in a **One-Day Certificate Training Programme** for *Master Volunteers* on 22nd of February 2025. This significant training event was organized at **Town Hall, Kupwara** by the **District Administration** in collaboration with the **National Institute of Social Defence, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India**. The programme focused on sensitizing youth volunteers on the ill effects of drug addiction, their role in awareness generation and the methods to counsel and support vulnerable individuals within the community. The volunteers received official recognition and certification, thereby qualifying them to act as frontline contributors in drug de-addiction initiatives at the district level.
